KNOW YOUR FAITH. . . .

Did you know that **St. Peter's in Rome IS NOT the diocesan cathedral of the Bishop of Rome**, presently Pope Benedict XVI? That church is the Basilica of St. John Lateran, and since 1726 **it has had it's own feast day on November 9.**

In 312 Constantine gave the Lateran Palace back to Pope Militades for his residence after it had been confiscated by the Roman Emperor Nero, 54 -68 AD.

Popes lived in the Lateran Basilica for 1000 years as their primary residence except for 68 years from 1209 to 1377 when seven popes lived in Avignon, France.

Not only a papal residence, **the Basilica of St. John Lateran houses the Pope's Chair**, which is the New Testament representation of the Seat of Moses (Matt. 23:2-3). **The Pope teaches infallibly or "Ex Cathedra" from his chair.**

Pope Pius IX spoke "Ex Cathedra" in 1854 to declare the Immaculate Conception of Mary. Pope Pius XII spoke "Ex Cathedra" on Nov. 1, 1950 to declare the Assumption of Mary.

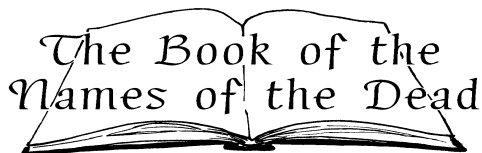
